New Year's Resolution - Attain Storage Security Competency!

With security breaches taking their toll within many companies in 2008, consider adding "Attain Storage Security Competency" to the top of your 2009 Resolutions List.

Storage security requires a cross-section of knowledge in information security, storage, and networking, according to the new **"Storage Security Professionals Guide"** published by the Storage Security Industry Forum. This month, we'll take a closer look at what information security knowledge is required.

Within information security, there are multiple options for vendor neutral certifications. The International Information Systems Security Certification Consortium (ISC)2 certification program is well aligned for what most storage security professionals will need, but it should not be considered the only option. Within the (ISC)2, the body of knowledge for the Systems Security Certified Practitioner (SSCP) and the Certified Information Systems Security Professional (CISSP) certification are particularly relevant. The Guide states that the SSCP should

be considered the minimum competency level, and the CSSSP is closer to the ideal.

According to the (ISC)2, the SSCP is ideal for those working toward positions such as Network Security Engineers, Security Systems Analysts, or Security Administrators, and for those in many other non-security disciplines that require an understanding of security but do not have information security as a primary part of their job description. The CISSP credential should be your next career goal if you plan to build a career in information security, and if you have at least five full years of experience in information security.

The (ISC)2 breaks the security common body of knowledge into domains . For the SSCP, competency and experience in seven of these domains is required:

Access Controls
Analysis and Monitoring
Cryptography
Malicious Code
Networks and Telecommunications
Risk, Response and Recovery
Security Operations and Administration

The CISSP requires competency in the full ten domains, as follows:

Access Control
Application Security
Business Continuity and Disaster Recovery Planning
Cryptography
Information Security and Risk Management
Legal, Regulations, Compliance and Investigations
Operations Security
Physical (Environmental) Security
Security Architecture and Design
Telecommunications and Network Security

The ISC recommends the following process to receive your (ISC)2 credential. First, possess the required years of experience. Second, study to review and refresh your knowledge. Third, complete the application to validate your education and/or experience. Fourth, sit and pass the appropriate exam. Fifth, commit to the code of ethics set forth by ISC, and finally, attest to your eligibility requirements.
